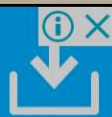
He had known all along that a day would come when Ye Fan settled his debts with the Chu family.

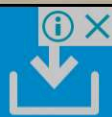
The look in Ye Fan’s eyes turned cold and in his cold eyes burned a raging fire.

Gaia stared as the young man disappeared into the horizon, then released a loud sigh of relief. His forehead was damp with cold sweat.

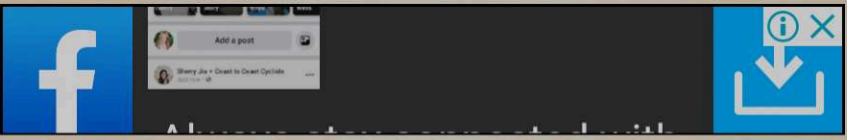
“The Dragon Master’s becoming more powerful and more terrifying,” sighed Gaia as he smiled wryly. It took him a long while to collect himself.
